## NYSCADV joins NNEDV in #Every1KnowsSome1 Month-Long National Campaign to Raise Awareness About Domestic Violence

Albany, NY — Each year in October, advocates, survivors, supporters, and allies recognize October as Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM). This October, The New York State Coalition Against Domestic (NYSCADV) is partnering with the National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV) and other state and territorial coalitions across the nation to start a coordinated national conversation about domestic violence and how we can all contribute to changing the narrative on this overshadowed, but fundamental topic.

More prevalent than most realize, one in four women and one in seven men will experience domestic violence in their lifetimes. Anyone, regardless of gender, race, sexual identity or orientation, or socio-economic status, can become a victim of domestic violence. This year's <u>campaign</u> theme, #Every1KnowsSome1, strives to highlight how common domestic violence is and that it is more than physical violence.

"The impact of domestic violence on New Yorkers is more significant than ever," said Connie Neal, Executive Director of NYSCADV. "New York State has the greatest demand for domestic violence support services in the country. Unfortunately, far too many requests for help and support go unmet because domestic violence advocacy programs do not have the resources they need to respond."

Throughout October, NYSCADV and NNEDV will be sharing content on their social media channels to help raise awareness and educate the public on the complex dynamics of domestic violence. A week of action is planned for October 18 – 24, 2021 designed to engage advocates, partners, and the public in starting a national conversation. NYSCADV is also hosting a public awareness and educational event that will be livestreamed on the <a href="NYSCADV Facebook page">NYSCADV Page</a> on Thursday, October 21 at 12pm.

To raise funds to support NYSCADV's work to prevent and end domestic violence, NYSCADV is once again hosting its annual Pumpkin Decorating Contest, a virtual event where participants of any age are invited to decorate a pumpkin and enter the contest by submitting a photo. Prizes are awarded to top contestants in four age categories, and a special Purple Pumpkin Award is also given. Early bird pricing is only \$10 through October 15.
