

In 2020 in New York State there were **78,522** intimate partner violence (IPV) related offenses. That equates to more than **215** reported IPV incidents every day.

According to the National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV), NYS has the highest demand for domestic violence services in the country.

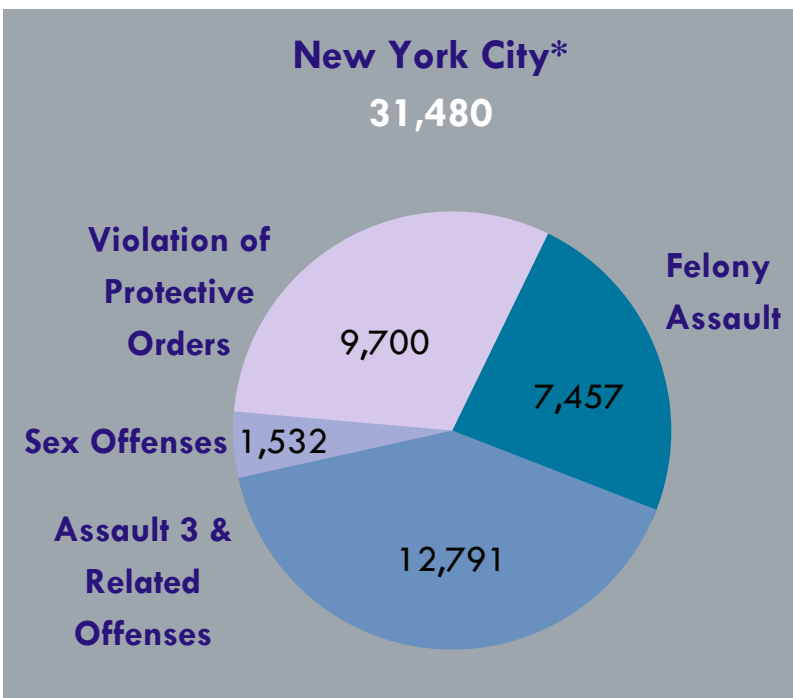
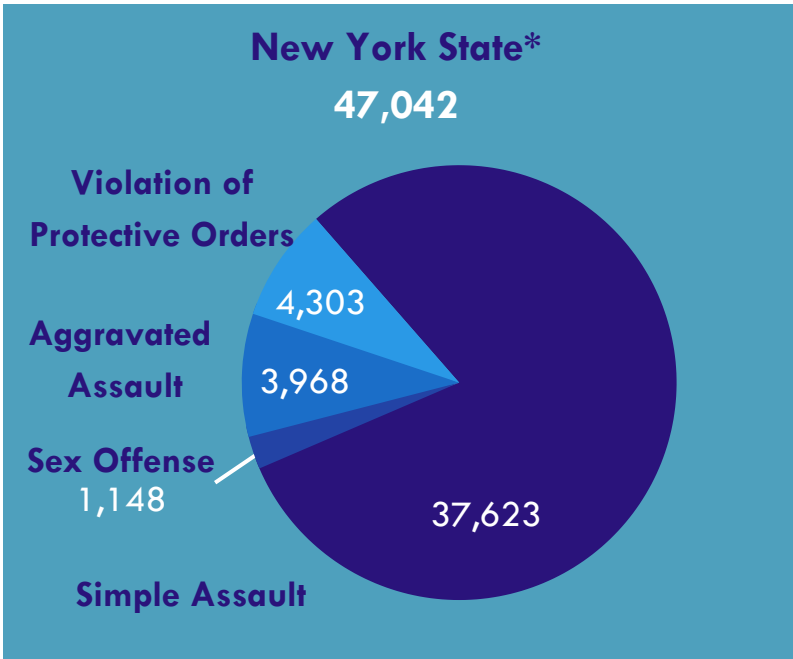
On just ONE DAY in 2021, 6,646 domestic violence survivors received help, such as emergency shelter, legal assistance, counseling, etc.

Another 766 victims didn't receive the help they needed because of critical funding and staffing shortages.**

NYS needs to prioritize funding for domestic violence programs to ensure that victims in need of shelter and other services are able to obtain the support they need immediately.
